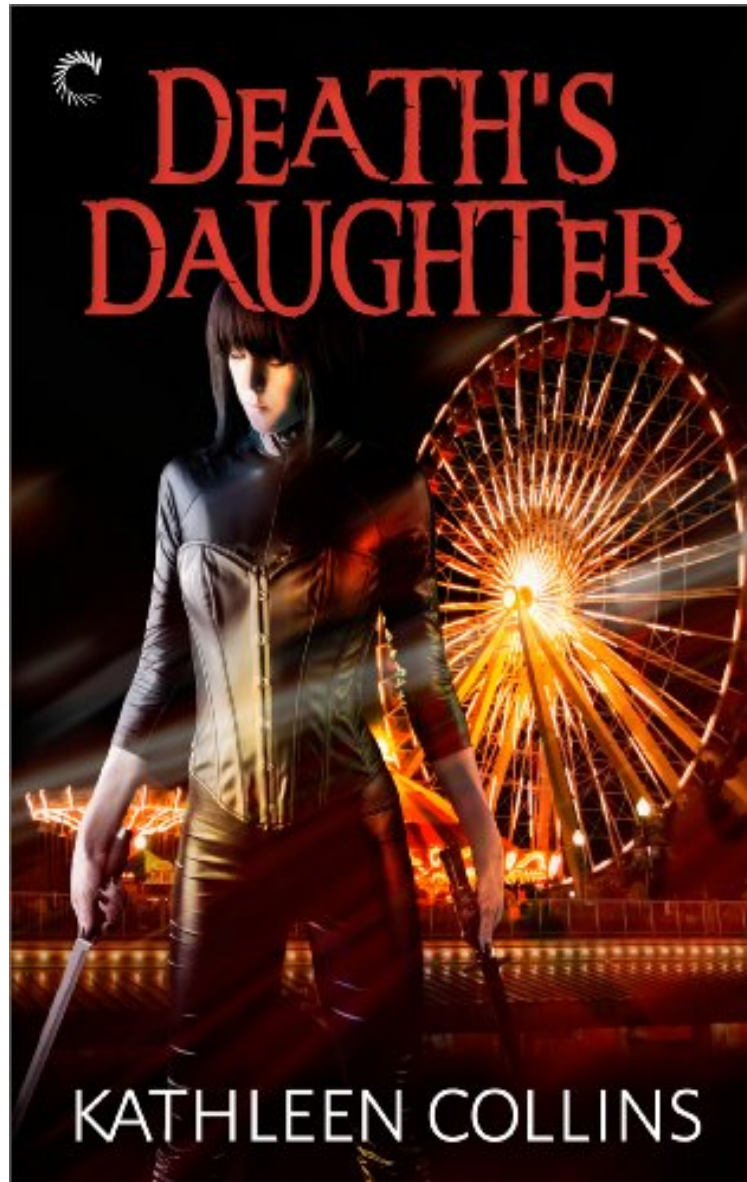

about the world and the characters. If you are new to this series, I recommend you stop reading here and start with "Realm Walker" and not spoil the fun.

Synopsis Another case for Juliana Norris, the half-blood-daughter of the dark fae god of death in her capacity as a Realm Walker for the Agency. This time, there is a serial killer on the loose, whose targets are Altered children. And to add to the mess, the killer seems to have no magic himself, but uses unstable, yet powerful wild magic. When the first victims appear dead and mutilated, time is running out for Juliana and her case team. Everything takes an even worse turn, when the killer seems to develop an interest in Juliana herself with none having a clue as to why. Adding to the taxing situation is the strained relationship she has with master vampire Thomas Kendrick who still has to struggle with who she became after he left her for so many years and the knowledge that her would-be killer and the bane of her existence, Vampire Raoul, is still alive. In a vampire kind of way.

Review This book is not for you, if you mind reading about gruesome murder and mutilation done to innocent children. I could stand it, as a remainder of my thriller and crime-fan days, but even though, I had to gulp a few times because of what this serial killer did to his victims. Wow. Abominable! But thankfully, the state the vics are in is not the only remainder of a thriller, but there is a very gripping, very solidly wrought criminal case that kept me reading on without being able to lay the book down. Although I had a good guess who the perpetrator could be about three quarters in the book [and I was right], the story stays exciting and the final fight is short, again gruesome and satisfying [well, it was for me, whatever that says about me]. The blend of agency work, and police procedural with the magic and UF world Juliana lives in, is done really great. And the more I know about Juliana, Thomas, the other characters and the world as such, the more I'm interested to get to know even more. To get to know, who Juliana's mother is, what happened in the first 12 years of her life that none seems to know about and that she doesn't remember. To know what more she can do, since I don't think all her powers are already revealed - neither to her, nor the reader. And since she is on the blacklist of her Agency boss for defying him time after time, and him being a real douche, I'm wondering how long she will take his s***, especially since she gets another rather interesting job offer. No, won't spoil that. Thomas again is his overbearing and possessive self, but I give it to him that he tries. He seems to have learned a lot from the events in "Realm Walker" and I appreciate that he gets that he has to change his attitude, if he wants Juliana back. As he observes at one point: the Juliana he left is truly gone and won't be back. So he better come to grips with it and do some character developing work. And since he does, I like him a lot more than in book one. Whenever he gets his s*** together, he and Juliana are so hot together. As is smoking hot, if you get my meaning. Again, Juliana's father makes an appearance and although I didn't imagine gods of death being that amiable and "human", for lack of a better word, I love his interactions with his daughter. I'm glad for her that even if she experienced hellish stuff in her life, her father obviously loves her. Makes this dark world a wee bit lighter. I can't wait for the next book to come out and will preorder as soon as possible.

Because whoever is kidnapping these children must be very powerful to wield wild magic. Very powerful, and very dangerous indeed.

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
